*HBRS, Vol. II, p. 232, places him at Michipicoten as early as 1806. +According to Minutes of Council (B.135/k/1) he was to be stationed at Nipigon but may have continued at Fort William.

George Simpson's opinion of McIntosh, written in his 'Character Book', 1831-32, was not high, *e.g.*, "Speaks Saulteaux, is qualified to cheat an Indian[but] perfectly Sober and honest." This has been published in *Hudson's Bay Miscellany*, HBRS, Vol. XXX, 1975, p. 188. The footnote contains references to a son, also called Donald.
