Farm Cash Receipts 2022

Last year was a big year for farm cash receipts in Manitoba and across Canada. Farm cash receipts provide a snapshot of the top line revenue in agriculture for the year. For the complete picture, including farm expenses and total net farm income, be sure to check back in late May when that data will be released.

Manitoba posted 2022 farm cash receipts of \$9.73 billion, up \$1.26 billion or 14.9 per cent from 2021. Canola, wheat, hogs, soybeans, cattle, potatoes, dairy, poultry, oats and corn comprise the top 10 sectors for cash receipts. Crop receipts contributed 62.4 per cent of total receipts for 2022, livestock generated 31.1 per cent, while direct payments totaled 6.5 per cent of receipts.

Our top three sectors by farm cash receipts were canola, wheat, and hogs – and all three set new records in 2022. Canola produced \$2.37 billion in receipts, which is 24.4 per cent of Manitoba's total farm cash receipts. Wheat brought in \$1.66 billion, representing 17.1 per cent of total receipts. Hogs contributed \$1.51 billion, providing 15.5 per cent of Manitoba's total farm cash receipts.

Compared to 2021, crop receipts rose \$802 million in 2022, to \$6.07 billion. Soybeans was the third largest crop by cash receipts at \$717 million, potatoes held fourth place with \$358 million and oats hung on to fifth spot with \$328 million in receipts. Manitoba has now had the highest potato cash receipts of all provinces for three years running!

In sixth spot, grain corn delivered \$272 million in receipts, a full 59 per cent higher than last year's record mark! Dry beans held seventh place with receipts of \$123 million, followed by dry peas with \$94 million, up a remarkable 92 per cent from \$49 million in 2021.

Manitoba's livestock sectors, likewise, produced strong receipts of \$3.03 billion in 2022, up 8.7 per cent from \$2.78 billion last year. The hog sector generates half of all livestock receipts at \$1.51 billion in 2022, an increase of 15.5 per cent over last year. Cattle and calf receipts rose by 9.5 per cent to \$688 million in 2022.

Receipts from supply-managed commodities were \$702 million in 2022, up 12.4 per cent compared to 2021. Supply managed commodities made up 23.2 per cent of total livestock cash receipts for 2022. Milk sales contributed \$354 million, up 8.5 per cent, while poultry contributed \$216 million, up 13.9 per cent and eggs contributed \$157 million, up 20.4 per cent. Sheep and lambs receipts at \$12.7 million were three per cent lower in 2022, compared to 2021.


Honey pulled in \$50 million in 2022 for a second-best result following last year's blockbuster \$52.2 million showing. Manitoba is Canada's second biggest honey producer, after Alberta, with 19.5 per cent of all Canadian honey receipts.

For 2022, program payments totalled \$634 million, up 51.8 per cent from 2021. Crop Insurance payments were \$419 million, private hail insurance was \$36 million, Agrilnvest was \$32 million and AgriStability payments came in at \$41 million. Direct payments comprised 6.5 per cent of total farm cash receipts for 2022.

Canadian farm cash receipts set a record in 2022 at \$94.9 billion, topping 2021 by 14.1 per cent. This was a broad and general rise, with all provinces individually achieving record receipts in 2022. Manitoba's share of Canadian farm cash receipts was 10.3 per cent.
