- In a confidential report made by Roderick Ross dated 25 January 1885, Colin McIntyre is described as follows: “Competent for Office work and as Indian Trader and Post Manager. Is at present in charge of opposition outpost at Souris River. Employed on Transport service during summer season. Conduct satisfactory – single.” A note by Chief Factor Fortescue dated 10 August 1888 states that Colin McIntyre is “A hardworking energetic officer most interested in the business and a good trader. Knows every Indian personally, speaks Cree well and understands Chipewyan. The only Clerk in the District fit to leave in charge during my temporary absence inspecting, etc.” (D.38/16)
