By leave, Mr. MAGUIRE for Mr. HELWER – Minister of Transportation and Government Services consider upgrading Provincial Trunk Highway #9 and the Selkirk Corridor thoroughfares immediately. (L. Hastings, S. Hastings, T. Wall and others)

Hon. Ms. WOWCHUK presented:

Supplementary Information for Legislative Review 2002-2003 – Departmental Expenditure Estimates – Manitoba Agriculture and Food.

(Sessional Paper No. 144)

By leave, Hon. Ms. WOWCHUK introduced Bill (No. 23) – The Pesticides and Fertilizers Control Amendment Act/Loi modifiant la Loi sur les produits antiparasitaires et les engrais chimiques, and outlined the purposes thereof, it was read a First Time.
