PRAYER

10:00 O'CLOCK A.M.

Immediately following the Prayer, Mr. LINDSEY rose on a Matter of Privilege regarding comments made by the Premier in the House on March 14, 2019 related to the Mining Community Reserve fund, contending that the Premier had knowingly misled the House and moved:

THAT the matter of the Premier knowingly misleading Manitobans about the Government's inaction in the face of a jobs crisis in the North be moved to an all-party committee immediately.

And Hon. Messrs. GOERTZEN and GERRARD having spoken.

WHEREUPON Madam Speaker informed the House she would take the matter under advisement.

Subsequently following the Prayer, Mr. WIEBE rose on a Matter of Privilege regarding comments made by the Premier indicating an intention to ignore the provisions in the Elections Act regarding the fixed election date and moved:

THAT this matter be referred to an all-party committee immediately.

WHEREUPON Madam Speaker informed the House she would take the matter under advisement.

Subsequently following the Prayer, Mrs. SMITH (Point Douglas) rose on a Matter of Privilege regarding proposed changes to election rebates and moved:

THAT this matter be referred to an all-party committee immediately.

And Hon. Mr. GOERTZEN having spoken.

WHEREUPON Madam Speaker informed the House she would take the matter under advisement.

Subsequently following the Prayer, Ms. LATHLIN rose on a Matter of Privilege regarding the government's intention to introduce Conflict of Interest legislation and misleading statements made by the Premier regarding his involvement with a private company and moved:

THAT this matter, especially the Costa Rica part, be moved to an all-party committee for consideration.

WHEREUPON Madam Speaker informed the House she would take the matter under advisement.

Subsequently following the Prayer, Mr. WIEBE rose on a Matter of Privilege regarding a statement made in the House on March 14, 2019 by Hon. Mr. GOERTZEN and requested that the Minister of Education and Training apologize to the Superintendent of the Winnipeg School Division and moved:

THAT the Minister of Education's statements, which are an attack on the administration of Manitoba School Boards, be moved to an all-party committee immediately.

And Hon. Mr. GOERTZEN having spoken.

WHEREUPON Madam Speaker informed the House she would take the matter under advisement.

Subsequently following the Prayer Mr. WIEBE rose on a Matter of Privilege regarding a letter sent to the Speaker of the House by the Leader of the Official Opposition in 2017 relating to the need for the Assembly to include a treaty land acknowledgement in the operations of the House and moved:

THAT the issue of treaty land acknowledgement be immediately referred to the Rules Committee for consideration and that the committee report back to the House at the earliest opportunity.

WHEREUPON Madam Speaker informed the House she would take the matter under advisement.

Subsequently following the Prayer Mr. LINDSEY rose on a Matter of Privilege regarding the Government Caucus spreading false information about NDP Members and moved:

THAT this issue be immediately referred to a committee of this House.

WHEREUPON Madam Speaker informed the House she would take the matter under advisement.

Hon. Mr. FIELDING moved and outlined its purposes:

THAT Bill (No. 21) – The Legislative Building Centennial Restoration and Preservation Act, be now read a First Time.
