The following Bills were read a First Time and had their purposes outlined:

(No. 18) – The Summary Budgeting Act (Various Acts Amended and Public Sector Executive Compensation Act Enacted)/Loi sur l'établissement du budget sommaire (modification de diverses dispositions législatives et édiction de la Loi sur la rémunération des cadres dans le secteur public) (Hon. Mr. FIELDING)

Hon. Mrs. STEFANSON, the Minister of Families, made a statement regarding the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Adoption Options.

The following petitions were presented and read:

Ms. ADAMS – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge Provincial Government to increase funding for licensed not for profit child care programs in recognition of the importance of early learning and child care in Manitoba which will also improve quality and stability in the workforce.

Mr. BRAR – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Minister of Agriculture to reconsider the changes to Crown land leases and instead create an agreeable strategy that satisfies all parties, specifically ranchers; to recognize the value of agriculture in the province of Manitoba and the value Crown land holds to farmers in sustaining their livelihood; and to understand the important role farmers play in the Manitoba economy and to allow them to take part in discussions that directly impact their livelihood.

Hon. Mr. WHARTON moved:

THAT Bill (No. 4) – The Manitoba Hydro Amendment Act/Loi modifiant la Loi sur l'Hydro-Manitoba, be now read a Second Time and be referred to a Committee of this House.
