PRAYER AND LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Immediately following the Prayer and Land Acknowledgment, Mr. BUSHIE rose on a Matter of Privilege regarding the Assembly's invitation to Pope Francis to include Manitoba in his upcoming visit to Canada to deliver an apology for the damaging legacy of Residential Schools. The Member noted that despite the fact that the Pope will not be visiting Manitoba, it was important for all MLAs to continue to advocate for the papal visit and moved:

Pursuant to Rule 27(1), Hon. Ms. SQUIRES, Ms. FONTAINE, Messrs. MICHALESKI and MOSES and Hon. Mr. JOHNSTON made Members' Statements.

The following petitions were presented and read to the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba:

Mr. Moses – To urge the Provincial Government to immediately provide comprehensive and free healthcare coverage to all residents of Manitoba regardless of immigration status, including refugee claimants, migrant workers, international students, dependent children of temporary residents, and undocumented residents; to urge the Minister of Health and Seniors Care to undertake a multilingual communication campaign to provide information on expanded coverage to all affected residents; to inform all healthcare institutions and providers of expanded coverage for those without health insurance and the details on how necessary policy and protocol changes will be implemented; and to create and enforce strict confidentiality policies and provide staff with training to protect the safety of residents with precarious immigration status and ensure they can access health care without jeopardizing their ability to remain in Canada.

Mr. ALTOMARE— To urge the Provincial Government to provide the services of two nurses to restore essential medical foot care treatment to the City of Thompson effective April 1, 2022.

MLA MARCELINO – To request the Minister of Labour, Consumer Protection and Government Services to consider granting the auditorium to the JRL by March 1st, 2023; to request the Minister of Education to recognize the value that JRL provides to the student population of EHS as well as the communities of Village de St Pierre Jolys and the RM De Salaberry; to request the Minister of Education and the Minister of Francophone Affairs to recognize that an MOU between the RRVSD and JRL is morally, financially and culturally beneficial; to request the Minister of Sport, Culture and Heritage to recognize the heritage potential of this important building and its status in the community; and to request the Minister of Sport Culture and Heritage to prevent any renovations to the auditorium that would destroy and devaluate the architectural integrity of the building.
