

PRAYER AND LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

1:30 O'CLOCK P.M.

Immediately following the Prayer and Land Acknowledgement, Mr. JACKSON rose on a matter of privilege alleging that the Honourable Member for Fort Rouge impeded his ability to serve his constituents by making disparaging comments about him, and moved:

THAT this matter be referred to a committee of this House.

And Hon. Min. FONTAINE having spoken,

WHEREUPON the Speaker informed the House he would take the matter under advisement.

Subsequently following the Prayer and Land Acknowledgement, Mr. EWASKO rose on a matter of privilege alleging that the Honourable Member for Fort Rouge's comments to the media and in the House damaged the Honourable Member's reputation as an educator, impeding his ability to serve his constituents, and moved:

THAT this House call on the Member for Fort Rouge to retract his inflammatory remarks and apologize, as well as direct this matter to an all-party committee for review.

And Hon. Min. FONTAINE having spoken,

WHEREUPON the Speaker informed the House he would take the matter under advisement.

Subsequently following the Prayer and Land Acknowledgement, Mr. KHAN rose on a matter of privilege regarding the manner in which the Minister of Finance responded to questions on Bill (No. 3), and moved:

THAT this House refer to this matter on an all-party committee for consideration.

By leave, the matter of privilege raised by Mr. KHAN was paused so that the House may consider Members' Statements, with the understanding that, after the five statements, the matter of privilege would immediately resume.
