PRAYER AND LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

1:30 O'CLOCK P.M.

Immediately following the Prayer and Land Acknowledgement, MLA LOISELLE rose on a matter of privilege regarding alleged objections by the Honourable Member for La Vérendrye to the use of French in the Chamber, and moved:

THAT the audio recordings be retrieved and distributed publicly recording last week's exchange during Question Period so that we can get to the truth of what was said by the Member for La Vérendrye and that the Member for La Vérendrye apologize on the record to every Member of this Chamber, to every francophone in Manitoba and every Manitoban for violating section 23 of *The Manitoba Act* and disrespecting the privilege given to all Members of this House.

And Messrs. NARTH and JOHNSON having spoken.

WHEREUPON the Speaker informed the House they would take the matter under advisement.

Immediately following the matter of privilege raised by MLA LOISELLE, Hon. Mr. KINEW rose on a point of order alleging that, during his response to that matter, the Honourable Member for La Vérendrye made comments that were inconsistent with the Rules of the Assembly on the use of both official languages.

And Mr. JOHNSON having spoken to the point of order,

WHEREUPON the Speaker informed the House they would take the matter under advisement.

Hon. Min. MOYES presented:

Reply to Written Questions (Nos. 1 to 3), asked by MLA LAGASSÉ on May 4, 2026:

1. Many constituents of Dawson Trail have expressed concerns regarding Sio Silica. Last month, Carla Devlin, President of Sio Silica, publicly stated that the Sio Silica project “will go forward after approval of an environmental licence.” Could the Minister of Environment and Climate Change clarify whether any assurances, formal or informal, have been given to the head of Sio Silica that would justify that level of certainty?
2. Given the President of Sio Silica’s public claim that the project is proceeding, could the Minister of Environment and Climate Change confirm whether the Provincial Government is actively considering a new environmental licence for Sio Silica, and also provide a clear timeline for such a decision?
3. The previous proposal by Sio Silica was rejected due to risks to drinking water and unproven extraction methods. The President of Sio Silica mentioned the mine has a 15 billion tonne deposit of silica sand and that it has the intention of mining all of it. What new scientific evidence has the Provincial Government reviewed, and has it now concluded that this project can proceed without endangering Manitoba’s aquifers and drinking water for thousands of Manitobans?

Hon. Min. NAYLOR presented:

Reply to Written Questions (Nos. 4 and 5), asked by MLA LAGASSÉ on May 20, 2026:

4. Could the Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure provide the specific criteria utilized by the Provincial Government to determine whether or not to approve speed limit reductions near schools, and how the communities in Landmark and Lorette currently measure up against those standards?
5. Residents of Dawson Trail, especially in Lorette, have repeatedly expressed concerns about children walking along a 70 km/h highway. Could the Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure advise what immediate steps will be taken in this constituency to improve pedestrian safety while a formal speed limit review is under way?
