DEBATE ON GOVERNMENT MOTION:

Hon. Min. FONTAINE - Special Committee on Local Journalism

THAT a Special Committee on Local Journalism be created to make recommendations on exploring the future of local journalism, including rural and cultural media such as French, Filipino, Punjabi and Chinese language publications, with the mandate to consider matters of public support for journalism, and report its conclusion to the Assembly within 30 days of the start of Fall Sitting 2025; and

THAT the composition of the Special Committee be:

- (a) four members designated by the NDP caucus, and
- (b) two members designated by the PC caucus; and

THAT the Special Committee be authorized to decide how it will conduct its business, including deciding to hold meetings at times and places it considers advisable to receive briefs and hear presentations; and

THAT, except as otherwise provided in this motion, the Special Committee shall have the same status and powers and follow the same rules and procedures as a Standing Committee of the House, including the power to establish a sub-committee for the purposes of carrying out any part of the Special Committee's work; and

THAT after adoption by the House, this motion may be amended only by:

- (a) unanimous consent of the House;
- (b) passage of a subsequent motion by the House; or
- (c) written agreement of all House Leaders if the House is not sitting.

And the Proposed Motion of Mr. JOHNSON in amendment thereto as follows:

THAT the first clause of the Motion be deleted and the following substituted as the new first clause:

THAT a Special Committee on Local Journalism be created to make recommendations on exploring the future of local journalism, including rural and cultural media representing all ethnicities and non-official languages, so long as they do not promote hate speech or undermine the Manitoba values of inclusivity and respect for all races, religions, and backgrounds, with the mandate to consider matters of public support for journalism, and report its conclusion to the Assembly within 30 days of the start of Fall Sitting 2025; and (Mr. SCHULER – 13 minutes)

As the Manitoba Legislative Building, also known as Manitoba Provincial Heritage Site No. 40, is a historical building in which alterations must be approved, could the Premier table a copy of any analysis and approval completed prior to the permanent alterations that occurred in March 2025 above the north side entrance?

- What was the total funding provided to the Winnipeg Police Service for the retail crime project in 2023/2024 and what were the statistical results of the project?
- 14. What was the total funding provided to the Department of Justice on retail crime projects outside of the Winnipeg Police Service and what were the statistical results of the projects?
- 15. Between budgets 2023/24 and 2024/25, outside of municipal police grant funding, how much funding was provided and/or promised to the Winnipeg Police Service and R.C.M.P.?

- 16. Aside from the funds provided to the Winnipeg Police Service and the R.C.M.P., how much funding was provided and/or promised to the other municipal law enforcement agencies for staffing?
- 17. On March 17th, 2025, Melissa Whitfield wrote to the Minister of Justice as well as the Premier on behalf of Joyce Barwick and Darrell Kempthorne. The letter contained specific questions that they had in relation to the death of their son Collin James Kempthorne after an assault occurred in September while he was being held in the Brandon Correctional Centre. This same letter was tabled during question period on April 7, 2025. To date, the Minister of Justice has not answered the eight questions put to him in that letter. Could the Minister of Justice provide the answers to those questions as well as his rationale for refusing to communicate with the parents of Colin Kempthorne?

PROPOSED RESOLUTION:

Mr. OXENHAM - Public Safety Strategy Progress

16. WHEREAS under the previous, failed, PC Provincial Government, crime skyrocketed in Manitoba due to its negligence; and

WHEREAS the previous, failed, PC Provincial Government were unable to address the root causes of crime in Manitoba; and

WHEREAS the previous, failed, PC Provincial Government left communities in Manitoba fearing for their safety due to its failure to address rising crime; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government is working to lower crime rates in the province through the Safer Neighbourhoods, Safer Downtowns Public Safety Strategy; and

WHEREAS this year, the results of those efforts have shown reductions in violent crime, crime severity and youth violent crime in Winnipeg, the first meaningful decrease in over a decade; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government has led the country with its five-point bail plan and brought back the electronic monitoring program cut by the previous Provincial Government; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government is working to bring law enforcement back into communities by hiring 24 new police officers this year to hit the streets and keep families safe.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba be urged to support the Provincial Government's public safety strategy, which is reducing crime and making our communities safer.
