The pig operation causes a lot of traffic from heavy trucks hauling animals & supplies. This wears away at the roads & they are not maintained enough as is to keep up with the traffic from these heavy vehicles.

With the expansion being nearly double it's original size, I can only imagine how much more traffic will come down those roads & further deteriorate their condition.

In the near future we are looking to expand to 30-5-2, and are concerned about smell. If the proposal goes through, we would like to see some benefits from it.
