In accordance with the Manitoba Environment Act (C.C.S.M. c. E125)

THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF ALBERT: "the Licencee"

for the construction and operation of the Development being a municipal well and water distribution project in the Rural Municipality of Albert subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

SPECIFICATIONS. LIMITS. TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

1. The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Environment Act Proposal dated January 24, 1995, and additional information contained in a letter dated March 21, 1995, both submitted to Manitoba Environment by the Manitoba Water Services Board on behalf of the Licencee.
2. The Licencee shall, prior to the commencement of construction, receive the approval of the Director for final plans showing the location of the works associated with the Development, as well as a proposal for the mitigation of construction impacts on Loggerhead Shrikes. The mitigation proposal shall be developed in consultation with Manitoba Natural Resources.
3. The Licencee shall dispose of waste construction material at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to *Manitoba Regulation 150/91R* respecting *Waste Disposal Grounds*. Waste construction material shall not include soil from excavation or trenching operations.
4. The Licencee shall ensure that the operation of the municipal water supply is in accordance with Manitoba Regulations under the Public Health Act and all operating requirements as recommended by Manitoba Environment.
5. The Licencee shall ensure that all used oil products and other regulated hazardous wastes generated by the machinery used in the construction of the Development are collected and disposed of in accordance with applicable Manitoba Environment and legislation requirements.
6. The Licencee shall ensure that fuel storage areas established for the construction of the Development are located a minimum distance of 100 metres away from all lakes and streams, and shall comply with the requirements of *Manitoba Regulation 97/88R* respecting *Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products*.

REVOCATION

If, in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not complied or is not complying with the specifications, terms or conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke this Licence either temporarily or permanently.
