#### EFINITIO. AS

In this Licence:

"all-weather road means a gard and/or graveled road that may be passable by vehicles and and dry weather conditions;

"Valer" means ve tation of sufficient height and density to act as a visual barrier tween a harvested ea and a road, or a band or area left around sensitive sites such as water by as, wildlife abitat, etc.;

ince road" cans a temporary ungraveled road with minimal grade development, that may be passed by vehicles only when dry or frozen;

"cutove" means an area from which timber has been harvested;

"cutting block" means a forested area with defined boundaries in which specific forest stands or parts thereof are approved for harvest;

- "Director" means an employee so designated pursuant to The Act;
- "habitat" means the place where an organism lives and/or the conditions thereof, including soil, vegetation, water and food;
- "harvesting" means the cutting and removal of trees from a forested area;
- "ice bridge" means a temporary crossing constructed from ice, snow, a for log man that may be passable by vehicles under frozen conditions;
- "I.R.M.T." means the regional Integrated Resource Manage and Team of Manitol Natural Resources located in the Northwest Region (The as), the North at Region (Thompson), the Western Region (Dauphin), and the Central Pation (Gazin and composed of members of the following branches of the Pepartman. - "silviculture" me and methods used to tend, harvest and replace forests;
- **site preparation** neans the physical or chemical methods used to prepare a site for planting to prome natural reforestation;
- means the residue left on the ground after harvesting, including unused logs, oted streams, branches, tops, etc.;
- "stand means a community of trees sufficiently uniform in species, age, arrangement or condition to be distinguishable as a group from the forest or other growth on the area;
- "succession" means the replacement of one plant community by another in progressive development toward climax vegetation;

"winter road" means a road which is capable of being used only in winter.

## SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITION

- The Licencee shall ensure the volume of softwood harvest does not exceed 24,153.85 m<sup>3</sup>, and the volume of hardwood harvested does not exceed 2,039.40 m<sup>3</sup>, as identified in the 1995/96 Quota Holder Annual Harvest Plan.
- 2. The Licencee shall ensure that all harvest and associated activity occur is the geographical boundaries of Forest Management 11, 13, as pecifically identified in the 1995/96 Quota Holder Annual Harvest Plan at the state of the pecific all products and the state of the state
- 3. The Licencee shall carry out harvest ccordance with ed activ practices set out in "Forest Mana nent Gui ines for V life in Manitoba", "Recommended Buffer Zones for es in Lakes and Streams tecting ded Fish Protection Procedures for in Forest Cutting Areas", and "Rea Stream Crossings in Manitob and any her provincial guidelines which may be adopted for forest management a ities.
- 4. The Licencee shall as direct by the x M.T., design and/or modify cutting block layouts and rock dans in ord to mitigate and use and access impacts that may be identified through overnoon at and public review of proposed activities. Resources and land use which the elimpacted, include but are not limited to:
  - (i) will fe and fish hources;
  - ive, threatened or unique wildlife habitat;
  - (iii) rare endangered flora and fauna;
  - (iv) provicial parks and ecological reserves;
  - (v) herit e resources;
  - (replies;
  - vii) local ommunities;
  - (viii) r ote lodge and outfitter operations;
  - (ix) Ecreation; and
  - (x) First Nations treaty lands.
- 5. The Licencee shall, as directed by the I.R.M.T., minimize soil disturbance to sensitive areas such as dry upland ridges and wet soils, by scheduling harvesting to avoid times when the sites are sensitive to surface disturbance, and by using harvest methods which will reduce surface disturbance impacts.

#### 6. The Licencee shall:

- (i) comply with the minimum buffer widths set out in "Recommended Buffer Zones for Protecting Fish Resources in Lakes and Streams in Forest Cutting Areas", "Forest Management Guidelines for Wildlife in Manitoba" and any other buffer requirements specified by the I.R.M.T.; and
- (ii) design and/or modify buffers to ensure post-harvest rup not negatively affect sediment loads in local waterbodies, as a fected by the I.R.M.T..
- 7. The Licencee shall not conduct forest management activities in a vestablished buffer, except where the I.R.M.T. conducts site specific inspection, and grant approval subject to conditions which will protect environmental and restrict qualities.

#### 8. The Licencee shall:

- ensure a minimum 50 meter is far is marked between narvest areas and Provincial Trunk Highway or municipal modes unless directed otherwise by the I.R.M.T.; and
- ensure a minimum 3t leter but as maintained between borrow pits and Provincial Trunk Highway or multipal roads, unless directed otherwise by the I.R.M.
- 9. The Licencee state ensure materials and in the construction of ice bridges (other than ice to pow), as removed from the site prior to spring break-up.
- 10. The Licer ee shall cose of slash and harvesting debris as directed by the I.R.M.T..

## 11. The Licence

- reportare, threatened or endangered species or ecosystems, as prescribed by the R.M.T., that are identified during the course of normal pre-harvest and proad construction activities; and
- (ii) are y measures to protect rare, threatened or endangered species or cosystems, as directed by the I.R.M.T..

#### 12. The Licencee shall:

- (i) evaluate the potential for the occurrence of heritage resources on areas where forest management activities will occur, and the potential for forest management activities to impact heritage resources, as directed by the I.R.M.T., in consultation with the Historic Resources Branch of Manitoba Culture, Heritage and Citizenship; and
- (ii) apply measures to protect heritage resources, as directed by Ae I.R.M. in consultation with the Historic Resources Branch of Anitoba Culture Heritage and Citizenship.
- 13. The Licencee shall ensure all-weather or chance roads a constructed.
  - (i) to prevent impacts on surface or subsurfact ainage; ?
  - (ii) only to the extent required, as determined by I.P. Z.T.,
- 14: The Licencee shall ensure that road copy acts is done as more er which will prevent erosion, as directed by the I.P. 1.T.. The shall include a to:
  - (i) reducing the slope of the side as of borrow pits, ditches and road shoulders; and
  - (ii) minimizing gradinal and/tousing her control measures in roadside ditches.

## 15. The Licencee sh.

- (i) clos and/or realitate all-weather roads, as directed by the I.R.M.T.;
- close and/or repullitate all chance and winter roads following the completion of harve and silvicultural activities at each cutting block, as the LR M.T.; and
- (iii) refore all chance and winter roads, as directed by the I.R.M.T..

#### s. The Licencee all:

- site operate and rehabilitate borrow pits, camp sites, landing sites and age sites, as directed by the I.R.M.T.;
- ii) Insure adequate containment protection is implemented for all sites when conducting vehicle or equipment maintenance activities, as directed by the I.R.M.T.;
- (iii) adopt environmentally sensitive servicing techniques including the collection and recycling (or disposal by a means acceptable to Manitoba Environment), of waste oil and anti-freeze;

- (iv) report and clean up spills in excess of 50 liters, as directed by Manitoba Environment's Emergency Response Team;
- (v) dispose of domestic and industrial waste as directed by the I.R.M.T., in consultation with Manitoba Environment.
- 17. The Licencee shall comply with Manitoba Regulation 97/88 R, "Storage And Handling Of Gasoline And Associated Products Regulation" a toba Regulation 172/85, "Regulation Respecting The Handling, Offering For Transport And Transporting Of Dangerous Goods".
- 18. The Licencee shall mitigate potential impacts on wood and carn eagle an osprey nests, as well as great grey owl habitat and her rookeries, as frected the I.R.M.T..
- 19. The Licencee shall comply with the requirements of the Manitoba Vorkplace Safety and Health Act and regulations perfect there.

If, in the opinion of the Director, he Lice e has exceeded or is exceeding the specifications, limits, terms or conditions set a herein, the Director may revoke, temporarily or permanently, the large conditions are conditions.

### ST GE 2 LY LINCE TERM AND REVIEW

Unless earlier revied for no compliance, this Licence shall be in effect until April 30, 1996. However, ould any charges to government policy occur that could affect the harvestip them of the Licence and detailed in the the 1995/96 Quota Holder Annual Harvest Plan, Mod. Section, Forest Management Units 11 and 13, a Licence review will be condited, with subsequent revisions or amendments to the specifications, and the second team of this Licence.
