

## Campground Tips

- Be Wildlife Smart. Do not feed any wildlife, including birds or squirrels. You are in black bear country - secure all attractants such as food, cooking equipment and trash in a locked vehicle. Do not store food or attractants in your tent.
- Practice Leave No Trace. Pack out all gear and trash to keep the campsites clean for others.
- Keep dogs on leash and clean up after your pet.
- Learn to recognize and avoid poisonous plants such as poison ivy.
- Open fires are prohibited. Use portable stoves or fire pits provided.
- Don't Move Firewood - Moving firewood can spread harmful invasive species and destroy our forests.
- Prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. Always clean, drain, dry watercraft and water related equipment. Visit [manitoba.ca/stopais](http://manitoba.ca/stopais) for full regulations.
- In case of injury or illness contact a Park Attendant or Park Patrol Officer. They can assist you to reach medical help.

## Beresford Campground

- Admire a crystal lake rimmed with granite rock



**K**nown for its fantastic fishing and wonderful water activities, Beresford Campground is located beside Beresford Lake in Nopiming Provincial Park. Small and secluded, this quiet campground is made up of 28 sites. 19 sites are available for nightly camping. Enjoy the picturesque rock shoreline. A fish cleaning station is provided for your convenience. A boat launch is just down the road from the campground.

Beresford Lake is a great place to take a break from the hubbub of the city. Drive through the campground into shield country where crystal lakes are rimmed with granite rock. Take a walk on the outcrops for a splendid view of the lakes and boreal forest dominated by jack pine. Poplar, black spruce and birch

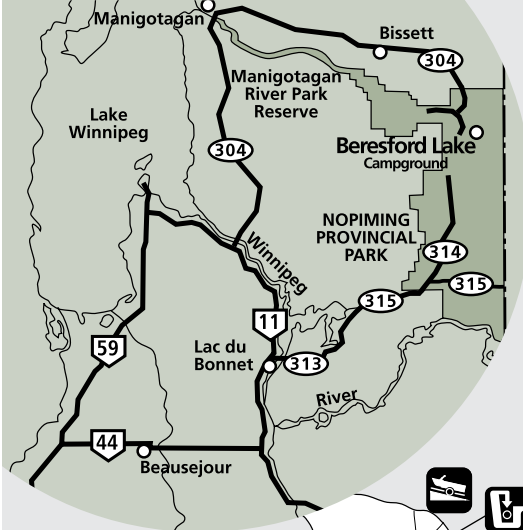
line the water's edge. Watch for wildlife including woodland caribou, moose, black bear and bald eagles soaring overhead.

Fishing is a must at Beresford Lake. The crystal blue water is teeming with northern pike, walleye and smallmouth bass. Explore the waterways by canoe along the Bird and Manigotogan Rivers. Retrace the path of the aboriginal people who once travelled these waters.

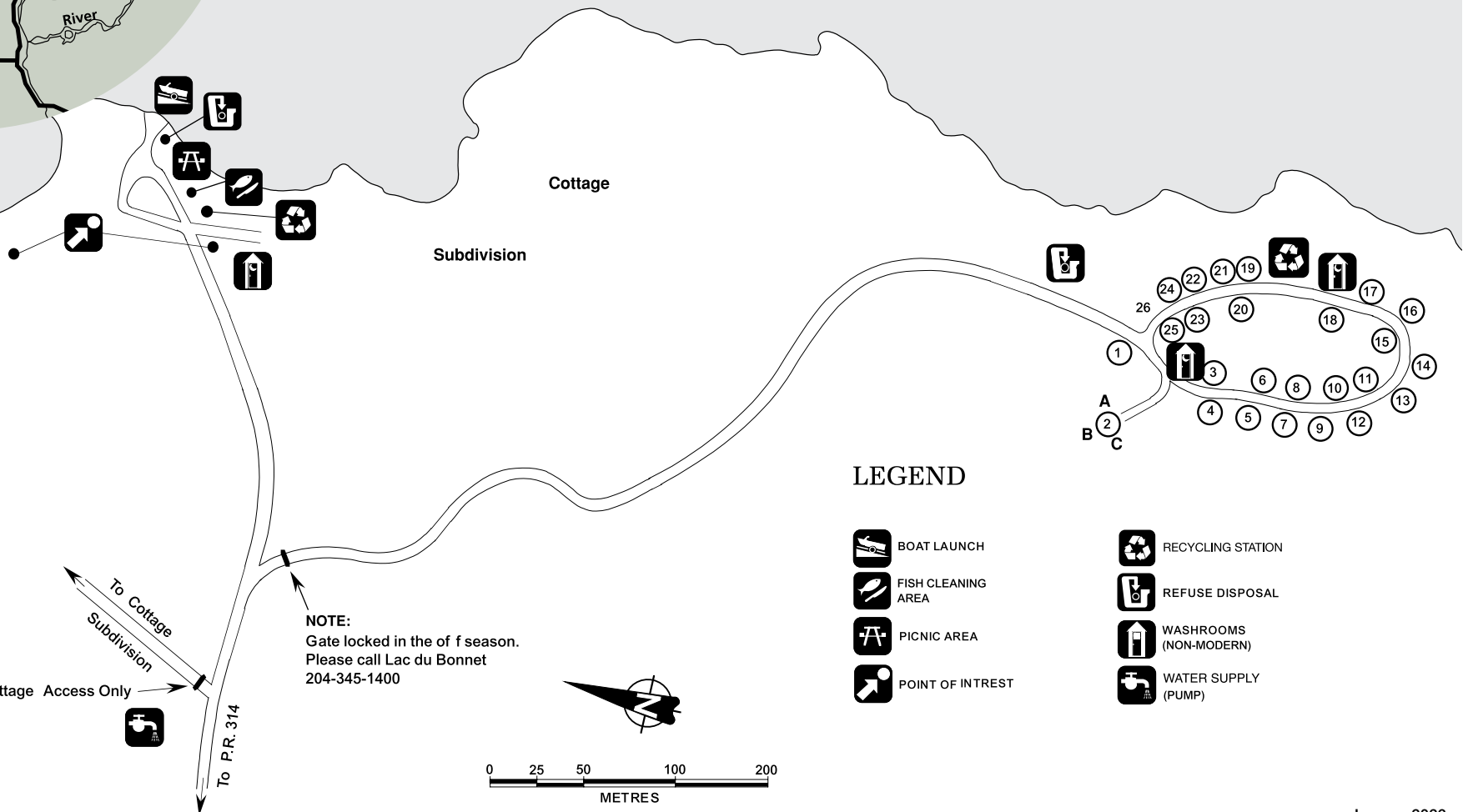
