

## Campground Tips

- Be Wildlife Smart. Do not feed any wildlife, including birds or squirrels. You are in black bear country - secure all attractants such as food, cooking equipment and trash in a locked vehicle. Do not store food or attractants in your tent.
- Practice Leave No Trace. Pack out all gear and trash to keep the campsites clean for others.
- Keep dogs on leash and clean up after your pet.
- Learn to recognize and avoid poisonous plants such as poison ivy.
- Open fires are prohibited. Use portable stoves or fire pits provided.
- Don't Move Firewood - Moving firewood can spread harmful invasive species and destroy our forests.
- Prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. Always clean, drain, dry watercraft and water related equipment. Visit [manitoba.ca/stopais](http://manitoba.ca/stopais) for full regulations.
- In case of injury or illness contact a Park Attendant or Park Patrol Officer. They can assist you to reach medical help.

- Jack pine and spruce trees create a peaceful solitude

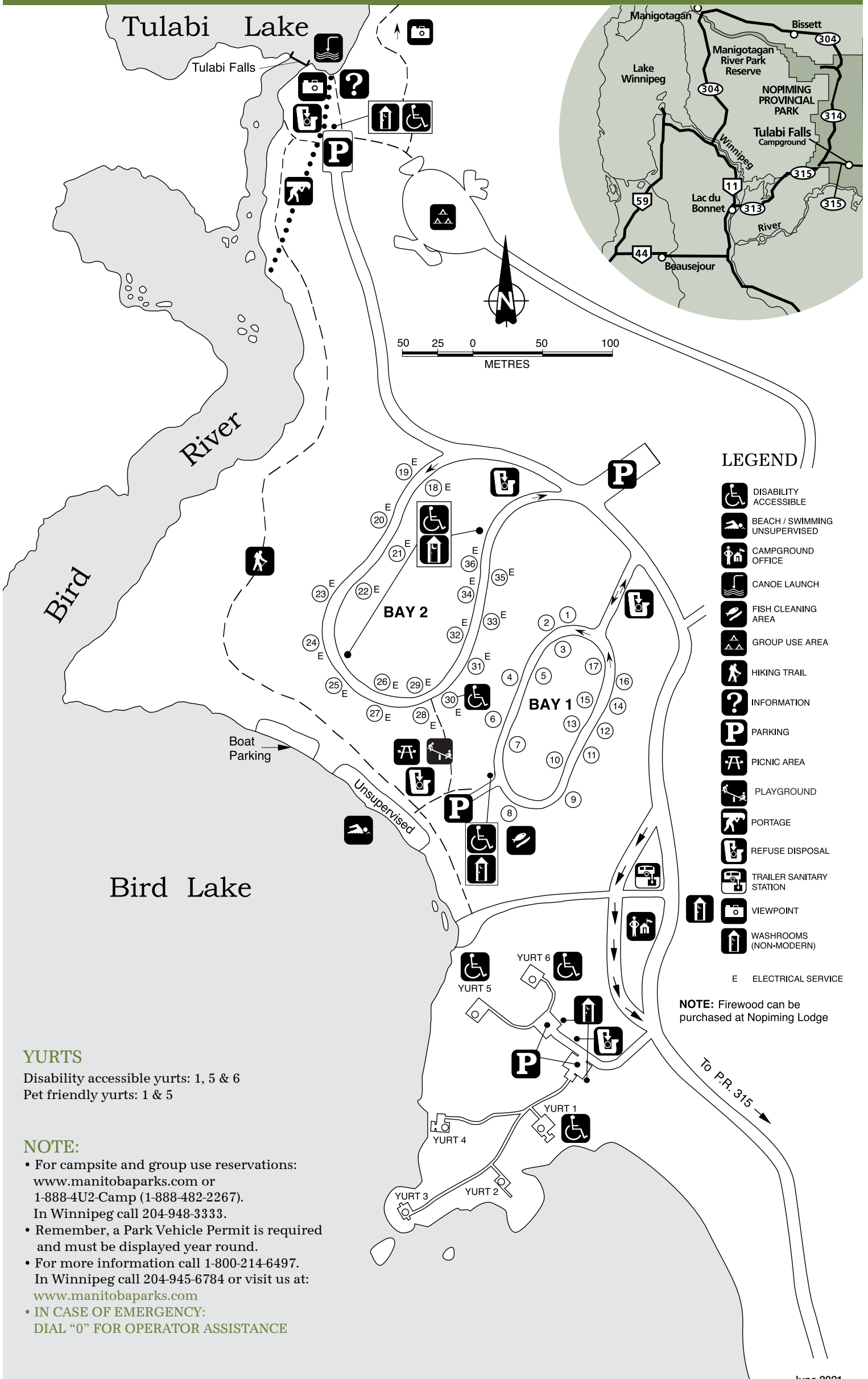


Located in Nopiming Provincial Park - named "Entrance to the Wilderness" by the Anishinabe people; Tulabi Falls Campground offers 17 basic, 19 electrical campsites, and six yurts. Balsam fir, jack pine and spruce trees surround the campground creating a peaceful solitude unique to this location. Campground activities are within the campground area or in close proximity. A lodge and store with gas pumps are also nearby.

The campground is located on Bird Lake beside Tulabi Falls. Enjoy a day at the beach or take a refreshing dip in the clear water of the lake. Enjoy the spectacular view of Tulabi Falls. Bring your canoe for a relaxing paddle on Tulabi Lake or Elbow Lake canoe route. Hike the scenic Tulabi Falls trail and take in the fresh air. Bring your rod and enjoy a quiet day fishing for walleye, northern pike, perch and of course, tulabi. Experience the true wilderness in the rugged yet lush forests of this natural park.
